Cat's are recognized by the AAHA to have 4 main life stages with a fifth final life stage also known as the geriatric stage. Cats are considered Seniors starting at 10 years of age and remain in this stage for a varying amount of time before transitioning into being geriatric.

Nutrition: You've probably noticed a change in your pet's energy and metabolism, and how you feed your pet should reflect that. Less food more times a day is typically a great start to keeping your pet feeling satisfied. Monitoring weight, for both over and under, can help manage underlying illness and disease and promote longevity. Senior formulas are made to help support your older animal's needs. With cats, hydration is extremely important and a common problem amongst the species. Feeding wet food and having multiple water sources available can help.

Proactive Health: According to AAHA, most cats have some form of periodontal disease by age 3. Several pet parents have reported "a whole new pet" after getting their pet's teeth cleaned, depending on the health status of your pet, your vet may be interested in doing a cleaning. At the geriatric stage, it's important to work closely with your vet to catch diseases early. You should consider doing two routine checkups a year with the vet to monitor for common senior health problems. Cats are great at hiding pain. Catching issues early, makes them easier to treat and deal with and helps keep your pet comfortable and happy.

Behavior: Any behavior changes should always be discussed with your vet. Watch for changes in your pet's relationship with you, family members, other animals, and people. Make sure to document antisocial or "grumpy" behavior, changes in attitude, or if you're worried about mental awareness. Many issues that appear with older age can be addressed and corrected with early intervention through medical, dietary, or pain management.

Lifestyle and safety: It is up to you to keep your senior happy and healthy. Minor changes to your pet's environment, such as steps to climb up to their favorite laying spot, can go a long way in their comfort and avoidance of injury.
